Cleveland University-Kansas City requires at least 90 semester hours of college credit, 24 of which must be life or physical science hours, prior to entrance. Grades in each course must be a “C” or better. Credits in excess of 90 hours will also be used in the computation of a student’s cumulative grade point average. Preferred GPA is 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Students who do not have the prerequisite science courses and have a high GPA, or GPA is below 3.00 but between 2.75-2.99, may be considered for admission under the Alternative Admissions Track Plan (AATP). Students admitted under AATP will be given a personalized educational plan to optimize their opportunity for success. Contact an admissions advisor for additional information.

Transcripts are evaluated on an individual basis. Also, certain physical requirements are deemed essential for participation in and completion of all phases of classroom, lab and clinical activities. Courses over five years old must be approved by CUKC. Completion of a bachelor’s degree is strongly recommended. CUKC offers a B.S. in Human Biology.
