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The Associate of Arts degree (A.A.) at JCCC is a general transfer degree and partners well with the first two years of most bachelor degree programs. Students pursuing the A.A. may select courses that satisfy both the A.A. degree requirements and lower division requirements for a bachelor's degree at four-year institutions. The elective hours within the A.A. allow students to complete additional general education and lower division courses required for specific majors. The A.A. degree requires completion of 60 credit hours; please see <a href="JCCC">JCCC</a>
A.A. degree requirements. The maximum number of hours from a community college that will be applied toward a bachelor's degree at most four-year schools is between 60 and 63 credit hours or 50% of the degree.

Meeting with a JCCC counselor is strongly recommended for selection of appropriate courses.

Transfer credits for JCCC students are evaluated on a course-by-course basis at MU. All students must complete MU graduation requirements beyond the MU general education requirements.
